



## Labelling Requirements for Importing Wine into the UK

The following details must appear on labels of all wines imported into the UK:

<b>A statement of provenance</b>	i.e. Wine / Country of Origin / Geographical Indication / PDO / PGI status
<b>Category of product</b>	Usually “Wine” for still wines
<b>For sparkling wines only</b>	Indication of sugar content (e.g., Brut)
<b>Indigo Wine importer details</b> , which must be displayed as follows in a font height of 1.2mm or greater	Imported by: Indigo Wine Office 306, Access Self-Storage 141-157 Acre Lane London, UK, SW2 5UA +44 (0) 207 733 8391 <a href="http://www.indigowine.com">www.indigowine.com</a>
<b>The nominal volume</b>	e.g. 750ml
<b>Alcoholic strength</b>	e.g. 12.5% ABV  This <b>MUST</b> be shown to the nearest half percent, e.g. 12% or 12.5%, NOT 12.4%. The actual alcoholic strength of the wine must be within 0.5% tolerance of the figure shown on the label.
<b>An allergens statement</b>	e.g. “Contains Sulphites” which must be in English.  <b>“Contains Sulphites” must be written on the label if the sulphite content of the wine exceeds 10mg/l</b>
<b>A lot number</b>	
<b>The bottler or packager details</b>	If the product is bottled or packed in the EU

If any information is missing or incorrect wine can be seized by port health, and kept until it has been re-labelled, which is time-consuming and expensive!
